

On Wednesday April 26<sup>th</sup>, we had our Google Expeditions Day. Children were able to experience panoramic views and virtual 3D scenes including the Solar System, Rainforests, Egypt, Castles, Kruger National Park and the digestive system.

The children were so excited by their experiences, we thought we would share some of their thoughts about the day along with a few photos.

The free 'Google Expeditions' app can be downloaded onto Android or Apple phones and devices. A phone is more suitable for the 3D experience of the app, as this fits the 3D viewer.



KS1 children used the 2D option to give them panoramic views of their chosen expedition.

Charlie in Year 1 said. "I could see lots of animals. I like the under water. I liked the shark."



Matilda in Year 3 wrote, 'Today it was Google Expedition Day and it was awesome. I had lots of fun. Firstly, you would put the goggles on your eyes and your teacher would click on the scene your class had chosen. Our class chose the Amazon Rainforest. When we saw one of the pictures it looked like we were stuck in a tropical rainforest that was transformed into a cylinder. We also looked at a scene under water and it was epic. We saw dolphins that were swimming happily. Finally, one of the pictures we saw had a killer whale in it and everybody gasped. I was also shocked.'
