<p>Humanities & Citizenship (RE, History, Geography, Moral & Social and Economic awareness)</p>	<p>Research different types of renewable energy. Pick one and explain how it works.</p>	<p>Plan a birthday party for 15 people. Your budget is £150. You need to decide how much to spend on each of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Entertainment (music, activities) • Food • Drinks • Party bags <p>You must explain why you have chosen the amounts for each.</p>	<p>Write the story of Easter in your own words with pictures.</p>
<p>Creative Arts (Art, Design & technology, Music, drama and dance)</p>	<p>Explore the work of William Morris. He is most famous for his wallpaper prints. Create your own image that you think would look good for wallpaper.</p>	<p>Create your own piece of music using your violin. Give your piece of music a name, and be prepared to perform for the class.</p>	<p>Using different materials (crayon, colouring pencil etc.), create rubbings of interesting item. Leaves, coins...</p>
